Please sponsor him (forms on church notice boards).</p> <p><b>Origin of the Lent Station Masses</b> "Station" comes from a Latin word simply meaning "the place where people gather or stand," and was hijacked by the railway industry in the 19th century. In Catholic culture there are "The Stations of the Cross," referring to the images of the Crucifixion story which mark the 14 stopping places, or the "Roman Mass Stations" which are traditional church locations and dates around Rome where the Pope (or a representative Cardinal) celebrates Mass during Lent for the local parish. In this country there has been a revival of the custom, and this is what we, the Coastal Deanery of East Anglia, will celebrate at Lowestoft on 11 March.</p>
