



REMEMBERING: Fr Mike writes: "Because November is the month of Remembrance, the parish is invited to recall not only those people who have departed this life, but also those people with whom we may have lost touch or not seen for a while because of the pandemic. It would be helpful when people come to mind if you could give me contact details in addition to names; and please do feel free to contact them yourselves and ask if they would like me to get in touch and arrange a visit, or whether there is any support that can be offered that might enable them to return to Mass. It is very important that we stay close as a parish community both during the darker nights of winter and also as the pandemic grinds onwards, and I would very much appreciate any assistance you can give me in this matter."
